Suggested supplies: If you do not have some of these supplies at home, and it is difficult to get them you can get by with the materials you do have.



For Drawing Students:

- **Pencils:** 4 Ticonderoga brand pencils (No. 2, soft, HB). They come in black as well as the familiar yellow.
- **Eraser:** a white rubber block eraser, any brand.
- **Paper:** good quality copier (bond) paper. 24 lb. wt. is preferred but 20 lb. works. "Office Works" or "Georgia Pacific" are good quality. Get a whole ream (300 to 500 sheets).
- **Straight Edge or ruler:** For when we want straight lines. If you're making your own, make it 2"x12" out of mat board.
- **Shaders:** These are very handy but if you can't find them it's OK. I'll be showing everyone how to make one from a paper towel. I've seen shaders at Michael's, Fred Myers might have them too.

For Painting Students: Bring what you already have for brushes, paint, mediums, and supports. Dry pastels can't be used in the class due to toxic dust. Oil pastels are fine as well as other mediums like watercolor, acrylic, and oils.
