



The intent of the assignment is to demonstrate the student's presentation skill, style, and effective communication near the end of the experiential work-based learning Cooperative Work Experience term. The video should consist primarily or even entirely of the student presenting, and can be as simple as a "selfie video." Video resolution appropriate for YouTube or social media is all that is required. The inclusion of music, presentation graphics, or another video/audio elements to help communicate the material is optional. The focus for evaluation is on the student's presentation skill, style, and effective communication sharing the content, so it is important the video include enough audio/visual of the student for that evaluation.

The specific video assignment is to create a video presentation to address the following:

- As you are near completion of the CWE course for the term, please describe your position title, and show where worked (if possible).
- Briefly incorporate your unique traits from the personality test description and the personality career test results that were discussed earlier in the term.
- Share if the tests provided a learning experience that highlighted some self-awareness and/or provided helpful insight into yourself, how you work on a team, and if your career selection was recommended for you.
- If your ultimate career wasn't recommended, were the suggestions closely related to your studies and your occupational choice? If not, why do you think?
- Lastly, share what your dream job is and discuss if this CWE experience solidified your decision to pursue your degree or certificate for that career by having this work experience.

Along with the video, please also provide a 1-page written explanation that explains and provides background in greater detail.

Your 3-5 minute video presentation should be directed to anyone that is interested in potentially doing a CWE course. Please include the YouTube shared link at the top of your one-page paper.

Written explanation, 1-page with YouTube link. Video presentation, 3-5 minutes.
